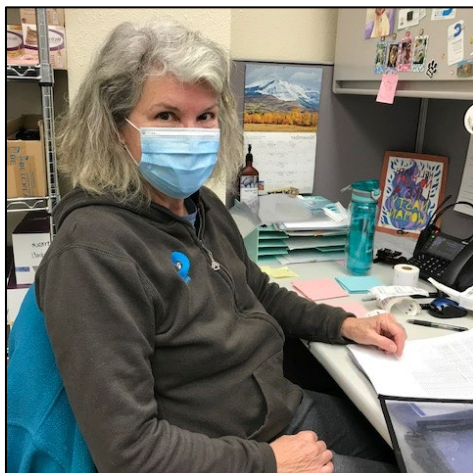
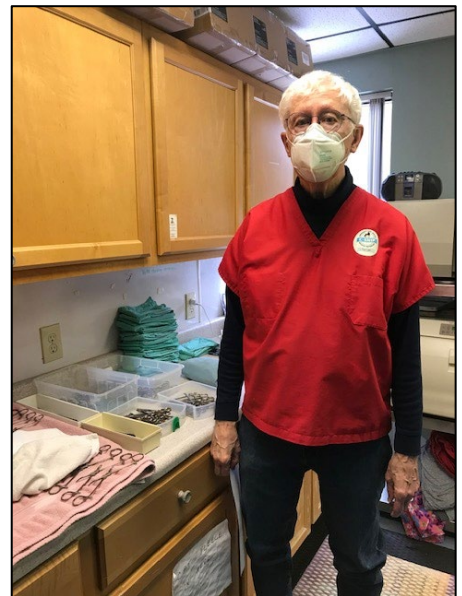
Celebrating CSNIP Volunteers During National Volunteer Month
